

**Romans 1:3-4**  
**“Declared By His Resurrection”**

Romans 1:1 **Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus**, called to be an apostle, set apart for the **gospel of God**,

Romans 1:2 which he **promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy Scriptures**,

Romans 1:3 concerning his Son, who was **descended from David** according to the flesh

Romans 1:4 and was **declared to be the Son of God in power** according to the **Spirit of holiness by his resurrection from the dead**, Jesus Christ our Lord,

Mark 8:31 And he began to teach them that the **Son of Man must suffer many things** and be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes and **be killed, and after three days rise again**.

Matthew 17:22 As they were gathering in Galilee, Jesus said to them, **“The Son of Man is about to be delivered into the hands of men,**

Matthew 17:23 and **they will kill him, and he will be raised on the third day.**” And they were greatly distressed.

Matthew 26:3 Then the chief priests and the elders of the people gathered in the palace of the high priest, whose name was Caiaphas,

Matthew 26:4 and plotted together in order to arrest Jesus by stealth and kill him.

Matthew 26:5 But they said, **“Not during the feast, lest there be an uproar among the people.”**

Matthew 26:31 Then Jesus said to them, **“You will all fall away because of me this night.** For it is written, ‘I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered.’

Matthew 26:32 But **after I am raised up**, I will go before you to Galilee.”

Matthew 27:26 Then he released for them Barabbas, and having **scourged Jesus, delivered him to be crucified.**

Matthew 27:27 Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the governor's headquarters, and they gathered the whole battalion before him.

Matthew 27:28 And they stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him,

Matthew 27:29 and twisting together a crown of thorns, they put it on his head and put a reed in his right hand. And kneeling before him, they mocked him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!"

Matthew 27:30 And they spit on him and took the reed and struck him on the head.

Matthew 27:31 And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the robe and put his own clothes on him and **led him away to crucify him.**

Matthew 27:32 As they went out, they found a man of Cyrene, Simon by name. They compelled this man to carry his cross.

Matthew 27:35 And **when they had crucified him**, they divided his garments among them by casting lots.

Matthew 27:36 **Then they sat down and kept watch over him there.**

Mark 15:25 And **it was the third hour when they crucified him.**

Matthew 27:50 And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice and **yielded up his spirit.**

John 19:31 Since it was the day of Preparation, and so that the bodies would not remain on the cross on the Sabbath (for that Sabbath was a high day), **the Jews asked Pilate that their legs might be broken and that they might be taken away.**

John 19:32 **So the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first, and of the other who had been crucified with him.**

John 19:33 But when they came to Jesus and **saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs.**

John 19:34 But one of the soldiers **pierced his side with a spear**, and **at once there came out blood and water**.

Mark 15:43 **Joseph of Arimathea**, a respected member of the council, who was also himself looking for the kingdom of God, took courage and **went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus**.

Mark 15:44 **Pilate was surprised to hear that he should have already died**. And summoning the centurion, he asked him whether he was already dead.

Mark 15:45 And when **he learned from the centurion that he was dead, he granted the corpse to Joseph**.

Mark 15:46 And Joseph bought a linen shroud, and **taking him down**, wrapped him in the linen shroud and laid him in a tomb that had been cut out of the rock. **And he rolled a stone against the entrance of the tomb**.

Mark 15:47 Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses **saw where he was laid**.

Matthew 27:62 The next day, that is, after the day of Preparation, **the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered before Pilate**

Matthew 27:63 and said, “Sir, we remember how that impostor said, while he was still alive, ‘**After three days I will rise.**’

Matthew 27:64 Therefore order the tomb to be made secure until the third day, **lest his disciples go and steal him away and tell the people, ‘He has risen from the dead,’ and the last fraud will be worse than the first.**”

Matthew 27:65 Pilate said to them, “**You have a guard of soldiers. Go, make it as secure as you can.**”

Matthew 27:66 So they went and **made the tomb secure by sealing the stone and setting a guard**.

Mark 16:1 When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, **so that they might go and anoint him**.

Mark 16:2 And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, **they went to the tomb**.

Mark 16:3 And they were saying to one another, **“Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?”**

Matthew 28:2 And behold, there was a **great earthquake**, for an angel of the Lord **descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it.**

Matthew 28:3 His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow.

Matthew 28:4 And for **fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men.**

Matthew 28:5 But the angel said to the women, **“Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified.**

Matthew 28:9 And behold, **Jesus met them and said, “Greetings!”** And they came up and took hold of his feet and worshiped him.

Matthew 28:10 Then Jesus said to them, **“Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me.”**

Matthew 28:11 **While they were going**, behold, **some of the guard** went into the city and told the chief priests all that had taken place.

Matthew 28:12 And when they had assembled with the elders and taken counsel, **they gave a sufficient sum of money to the soldiers**

Matthew 28:13 and said, **“Tell people, ‘His disciples came by night and stole him away while we were asleep.’**

Matthew 28:14 And if this comes to the governor’s ears, **we will satisfy him and keep you out of trouble.”**

Matthew 28:15 So they took the money and did as they were directed. **And this story has been spread among the Jews to this day.**

Luke 24:9 and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest.

Luke 24:10 Now it was Mary Magdalene and Joanna and Mary the mother of James and the other women with them who told these things to the apostles,

Matthew 28:17 And when they saw him they worshiped him, **but some doubted.**

Acts 10:39 And **we are witnesses** of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. **They put him to death by hanging him on a tree,**

Acts 10:40 but **God raised him on the third day and made him to appear,**

Acts 10:41 **not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead.**

1Corinthians 15:3 For I delivered to you as of **first importance** what I also received: that **Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures,**

1Corinthians 15:4 that **he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures,**

1Corinthians 15:5 and that **he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve.**

1Corinthians 15:6 Then **he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive,** though some have fallen asleep.

1Corinthians 15:7 Then **he appeared to James, then to all the apostles.**

1Corinthians 15:8 **Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me.**

1Corinthians 15:12 Now **if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead?**

1Corinthians 15:13 But **if there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised.**

1Corinthians 15:14 And **if Christ has not been raised,** then our preaching is in vain and **your faith is in vain.**

1Corinthians 15:15 We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified about God that he raised Christ, whom he did not raise **if it is true that the dead are not raised.**

1Corinthians 15:16 For if the dead are not raised, **not even Christ has been raised.**

1Corinthians 15:17 And **if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins.**

1Corinthians 15:18 Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished.

1Corinthians 15:19 **If in Christ we have hope in this life only, we are of all people most to be pitied.**

1Corinthians 15:20 But **in fact Christ has been raised from the dead**, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.

1Corinthians 15:55 “O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?”

1Corinthians 15:56 The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law.

1Corinthians 15:57 But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.
