Romans 13:8 Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law.

Romans 13:13 Let us **walk properly** as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarreling and jealousy.

Romans 13:14 But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

- 1Peter 4:4 With respect to this they are surprised **when you do not join them** in the same flood of debauchery, and **they malign you**;
- 1Peter 4:5 but they will **give account to him** who is ready to judge the living and the dead.
- 1Peter 4:6 For this is why the gospel was preached even to those who are dead, that though judged in the flesh the way people are, they might live in the spirit the way God does.
- 1Peter 4:7 **The end of all things is at hand**; therefore be self-controlled and sober-minded for the sake of your prayers.
- 1Peter 4:8 Above all, **keep loving one another earnestly**, since love covers a multitude of sins.
- 1Peter 4:9 Show hospitality to one another without grumbling.
- 1Peter 4:10 As each has received a **gift**, use it to **serve one another**, as good stewards of **God's varied grace**:
- 1Peter 4:11 whoever **speaks**, as one who speaks **oracles of God**; whoever **serves**, as one **who serves by the strength that God supplies**—in order **that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ**. To him **belong glory** and **dominion** forever and ever. Amen.
