

The Gospel According to Jeremiah

Jeremiah 1:1 The words of **Jeremiah**, the son of Hilkiah, one of the **priests** who were in Anathoth in the land of Benjamin,

Jeremiah 1:2 to whom the word of the LORD came in the days of **Josiah** the son of Amon, king of Judah, in the thirteenth year of his reign.

Jeremiah 1:3 It came also in the days of **Jehoiakim** the son of Josiah, king of Judah, and until the end of the eleventh year of **Zedekiah**, the son of Josiah, king of Judah, until the captivity of Jerusalem in the fifth month.

2Kings 22:1 Josiah was eight years old when he began to reign, and he reigned thirty-one years in Jerusalem. His mother's name was Jedidah the daughter of Adaiah of Bozkath.

1Chronicles 3:15 The sons of **Josiah**: **Johanah** the firstborn, the second **Jehoiakim**, the third **Zedekiah**, the fourth **Shallum**.

Shallum/Jehoahaz - Taken captive by Pharaoh Neco.

2Chronicles 36:2 **Jehoahaz** was twenty-three years old when he began to reign, and he reigned **three months in Jerusalem**.

2Chronicles 36:4 And the **king of Egypt** made **Eliakim** his brother king over Judah and Jerusalem, and **changed his name to Jehoiakim**. But **Neco took Jehoahaz his brother and carried him to Egypt**.

Jehoiakim / Eliakim - Taken captive by Nebuchadnezzar.

2Kings 23:34 And Pharaoh Neco made **Eliakim the son of Josiah** king in the place of Josiah his father, and changed his name to Jehoiakim. But he took Jehoahaz away, and he came to Egypt and **died there**.

2Chronicles 36:6 Against him came up Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon and bound him (Jehoiakim) in chains to **take him to Babylon**.

Jehoiakim's son - Jeconiah/Jehoiachin (*YHWH supports*) - Taken captive by Nebuchadnezzar.

Esther 2:5 Now there was a Jew in Susa the citadel whose name was Mordecai, the son of Jair, son of Shimei, son of Kish, a Benjaminite,

Esther 2:6 who had been carried away from Jerusalem among the captives carried away with **Jeconiah king of Judah**, whom Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon had carried away.

Zedekiah

2Kings 24:17 And the king of Babylon made Mattaniah, Jehoiachin's uncle, king in his place, and changed his name to Zedekiah.

Jeremiah 39:6 The king of Babylon slaughtered the sons of Zedekiah at Riblah before his eyes, and the king of Babylon slaughtered all the nobles of Judah.

Jeremiah 39:7 He put out the eyes of Zedekiah and bound him in chains to take him to Babylon.

Jeremiah 1:4 Now **the word of the LORD came to me**, saying,

Jeremiah 1:5 “**Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you; I appointed you a prophet to the nations.**”

Jeremiah 1:10 See, I have set you this day over **nations** and over **kingdoms**, to **pluck up** and to **break down**, to **destroy** and to **overthrow**, to **build** and to **plant.**”

Jeremiah 2:11 Has a nation changed its gods, even though they are no gods? But **my people have changed their glory for that which does not profit.**

Jeremiah 2:12 Be appalled, O heavens, at this; be shocked, be utterly desolate, declares the LORD,

Jeremiah 2:13 for **my people have committed two evils: they have forsaken me, the fountain of living waters, and hewed out cisterns for themselves, broken cisterns that can hold no water.**

Jeremiah 9:23 Thus says the LORD: “Let not the wise man boast in his wisdom, let not the mighty man boast in his might, let not the rich man boast in his riches,

Jeremiah 9:24 but let him who boasts boast in this, **that he understands and knows me, that I am the LORD who practices steadfast love, justice, and righteousness** in the earth. **For in these things I delight**, declares the LORD.”

Jeremiah 11:1 The word that came to Jeremiah from the LORD:

Jeremiah 11:2 “Hear the words of this covenant, and speak to the men of Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem.

Jeremiah 11:3 You shall say to them, **Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel: Cursed be the man who does not hear the words of this covenant**

Jeremiah 11:4 **that I commanded your fathers when I brought them out of the land of Egypt**, from the iron furnace, saying, **Listen to my voice, and do all that I command you**. So shall you be my people, and I will be your God,

Jeremiah 11:7 For I solemnly **warned your fathers** when I brought them up out of the land of Egypt, **warning them persistently**, even to this day, saying, **Obey my voice**.

Jeremiah 11:8 Yet they did not obey or incline their ear, but **everyone walked in the stubbornness of his evil heart**. Therefore I brought upon them all the words of this covenant, which I commanded them to do, but they did not.”

Jeremiah 13:22 You may ask yourself, “**Why is all this happening to me?**” It is **because of your many sins!** That is why you have been stripped and raped by invading armies.

Jeremiah 13:23 Can an Ethiopian change the color of his skin? Can a leopard take away its spots? **Neither can you start doing good, for you have always done evil**.

Jeremiah 17:5 Thus says the LORD: “**Cursed is the man who trusts in man** and makes **flesh his strength**, whose **heart turns away from the LORD**.

Jeremiah 17:6 He is like a shrub in the desert, and shall not see any good come. He shall dwell in the parched places of the wilderness, in an uninhabited salt land.

Jeremiah 17:7 “**Blessed is the man who trusts in the LORD**, whose **trust is the LORD**.

Jeremiah 17:8 He is like a tree planted by water, that sends out its roots by the stream, and **does not fear** when heat comes, for its leaves remain green, and is **not anxious in the year of drought**, for it does not cease to bear fruit.”

Jeremiah 17:9 The **heart is deceitful above all things**, and **desperately sick**; who can understand it?

Jeremiah 23:3 Then I will gather the **remnant of my flock** out of **all the countries** where I have driven them, and **I will bring them back to their fold**, and they shall be fruitful and multiply.

Jeremiah 23:4 I will set shepherds over them who will **care for them**, and they shall **fear no more, nor be dismayed**, neither shall any be missing, declares the LORD.

Jeremiah 23:5 “Behold, **the days are coming**, declares the LORD, **when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch**, and **he shall reign as king** and deal wisely, and shall **execute justice and righteousness** in the land.

Jeremiah 23:6 In his days **Judah will be saved**, and **Israel will dwell securely**. And this is the **name by which he will be called**: ‘**The LORD is our righteousness.**’

Jeremiah 23:23 “Am I a **God at hand**, declares the LORD, and not a **God far away**?

Jeremiah 23:24 **Can a man hide himself** in secret places **so that I cannot see him**? declares the LORD. **Do I not fill heaven and earth**? declares the LORD.

Jeremiah 24:6 **I will set my eyes on them for good**, and **I will bring them back** to this land. **I will build them up**, and not tear them down; **I will plant them**, and not pluck them up.

Jeremiah 24:7 **I will give them a heart to know that I am the LORD**, and they shall be my people and I will be their God, **for they shall return to me with their whole heart.**

Jeremiah 29:4 “Thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, **to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile** from Jerusalem to Babylon:

Jeremiah 29:5 Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat their produce.

Jeremiah 29:6 Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; **multiply there, and do not decrease.**

Jeremiah 29:7 But **seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the LORD on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare.**

Jeremiah 29:10 “For thus says the LORD: When seventy years are completed for Babylon, **I will visit you, and I will fulfill to you my promise and bring you back to this place.**

Jeremiah 29:11 For **I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope.**

Jeremiah 30:12 “For thus says the LORD: **Your hurt is incurable, and your wound is grievous.**

Jeremiah 30:13 **There is none to uphold your cause, no medicine for your wound, no healing for you.**

Jeremiah 30:17 For **I will restore health to you, and your wounds I will heal,** declares the LORD, because they have called you an outcast: ‘It is Zion, for whom no one cares!’

Jeremiah 31:3 the LORD appeared to him from far away. **I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore I have continued my faithfulness to you.**

Jeremiah 31:11 For the **LORD has ransomed Jacob and has redeemed him from hands too strong for him.**

Jeremiah 31:31 “Behold, the days are coming, declares the LORD, **when I will make a new covenant** with the house of Israel and the house of Judah,

Jeremiah 31:32 **not like the covenant** that I made with their fathers on the day when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt, **my covenant that they broke, though I was their husband,** declares the LORD.

Jeremiah 31:33 For **this is the covenant that I will make** with the house of Israel after those days, declares the LORD: **I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts. And I will be their God, and they shall be my people.**

Jeremiah 31:34 And no longer shall each one teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying, ‘Know the LORD,’ **for they shall all know me**, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the LORD. **For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more.”**

Jeremiah 32:26 The word of the LORD came to Jeremiah:

Jeremiah 32:39 **I will give them one heart and one way**, that they may fear me forever, for their own good and the good of their children after them.

Jeremiah 32:40 **I will make with them an everlasting covenant**, that **I will not turn away from doing good to them**. And I will put the fear of me in their hearts, that they may not turn from me.

Jeremiah 32:41 **I will rejoice in doing them good**, and I will plant them in this land in faithfulness, **with all my heart and all my soul**.

Luke 22:20 And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, “This cup that is poured out for you is the **new covenant in my blood**.”

Hebrews 8:6 But as it is, Christ has obtained a ministry that is as much more excellent than the old as the **covenant he mediates is better**, since it is **enacted on better promises**.

Hebrews 8:7 For if that first covenant had been faultless, there would have been no occasion to look for a second.

Hebrews 8:8 For **he finds fault with them** when he says: “Behold, the days are coming, declares the Lord, when I will establish a **new covenant** with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah,

Hebrews 8:9 not like the covenant that I made with their fathers on the day when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. For they did not continue in my covenant, and so I showed no concern for them, declares the Lord.

Hebrews 8:10 For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, declares the Lord: **I will put my laws into their minds, and write them on their hearts,** and I will be their God, and they shall be my people.

Hebrews 8:11 And they shall not teach, each one his neighbor and each one his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest.

Hebrews 8:12 **For I will be merciful toward their iniquities, and I will remember their sins no more."**

Hebrews 8:13 In speaking of a **new covenant, he makes the first one obsolete.** And what is becoming obsolete and growing old is ready to vanish away.

Hebrews 9:11 But when Christ appeared as a high priest of the good things that have come, then through the greater and more perfect tent (not made with hands, that is, not of this creation)

Hebrews 9:12 he **entered once for all into the holy places,** not by means of the blood of goats and calves **but by means of his own blood, thus securing an eternal redemption.**

Hebrews 9:15 Therefore **he is the mediator of a new covenant,** so that those who are called may receive the **promised eternal inheritance,** since a **death has occurred that redeems them from the transgressions committed under the first covenant.**

Hebrews 9:24 For Christ has entered, not into holy places made with hands, which are copies of the true things, but into heaven itself, **now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf.**

Hebrews 9:25 Nor was it to offer himself repeatedly, as the high priest enters the holy places every year with blood not his own,

Hebrews 9:26 for then he would have had to suffer repeatedly since the foundation of the world. **But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the ages to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself.**

Jeremiah 52:31 And in the thirty-seventh year of the exile of Jehoiachin (*YHWH supports*) king of Judah, in the twelfth month, on the twenty-fifth day of the month,

Evil-merodach king of Babylon, in the **year that he began to reign, graciously freed Jehoiachin king of Judah and brought him out of prison.**

Jeremiah 52:32 **And he spoke kindly to him and gave him a seat above the seats of the kings who were with him in Babylon.**

Jeremiah 52:33 So Jehoiachin (*YHWH supports*) **put off his prison garments. And every day of his life he dined regularly at the king's table...**
