In Any and Every Circumstance?

Written from prison, Philippians has been called “The Epistle of Joy”.

The word “joy” appears 5 times in the ESV.
(1:4, 1:25, 2:2, 2:29, 4:1)

The word “rejoice” appears 9 times in the ESV.
(1:18, 1:18, 2:17, 2:18, 2:28, 3:1, 4:4, 4:4, 4:10)

Philippians 1:12-18

**12 I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really
served to advance the gospel,
13 so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard and to all
the rest that my imprisonment is for Christ.**

Philippians 1:12-18

14 And most of the brothers, having become confident in the Lord by my imprisonment, are much more bold to speak the word without fear.

15 Some indeed preach Christ from envy and rivalry, but others from good will.

16 The latter do it out of love, knowing that I am put here for the defense of the gospel.

17 The former proclaim Christ out of selfish ambition, not sincerely but thinking to afflict me in my imprisonment.

Persecution advances the Gospel (1:12-13)

**12 I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really
served to advance the gospel,
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Persecution requires obedience (1:12-13)

- To obey God and resist the devil - James 4:7
- To obey God and look different than the world - Romans 12:1-2
- To obey God and not our fleshly passions - 1 Peter 1:14-15

Persecution grows the church (1:14-17)

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“As a pastor (Christian), my disobedience is part of the Gospel mission. The great mission of Christ requires our great resistance to the world. The purpose of resisting is not to change the world, but to witness another world.”

— Wang Li



Pastor Wang Yi and his wife Jiang Rong were both taken away at different times during the recent raid on Early Rain Covenant Church.

Because the mission of the church is simply to become a church and not to be part of any secular system. From a negative perspective, the church must separate itself from the world and avoid letting itself be institutionalized by the world. From a positive perspective, all actions of the church are efforts to prove to the world the true existence of another world. The Bible teaches us that we can only obey God and not obey people in matters concerning the gospel and human conscience. Therefore, **the disobedience of faith and the patience of the body are the ways we witness another eternal world and another glory king.**

This is why I am not interested in changing any political and legal system in China, and I am not even interested in when the policy of the Chinese Communist regime persecution of the church will change. No matter whether I live under any regime now or in the future, as long as the secular government continues to persecute the church and harm the human conscience that belongs to God alone, I will continue to resist the faith. Because **all the missions that God has given me are through all my actions so that more Chinese understand that the hope of mankind and society lies only in the redemption of Christ, in the supernatural grace of God.**

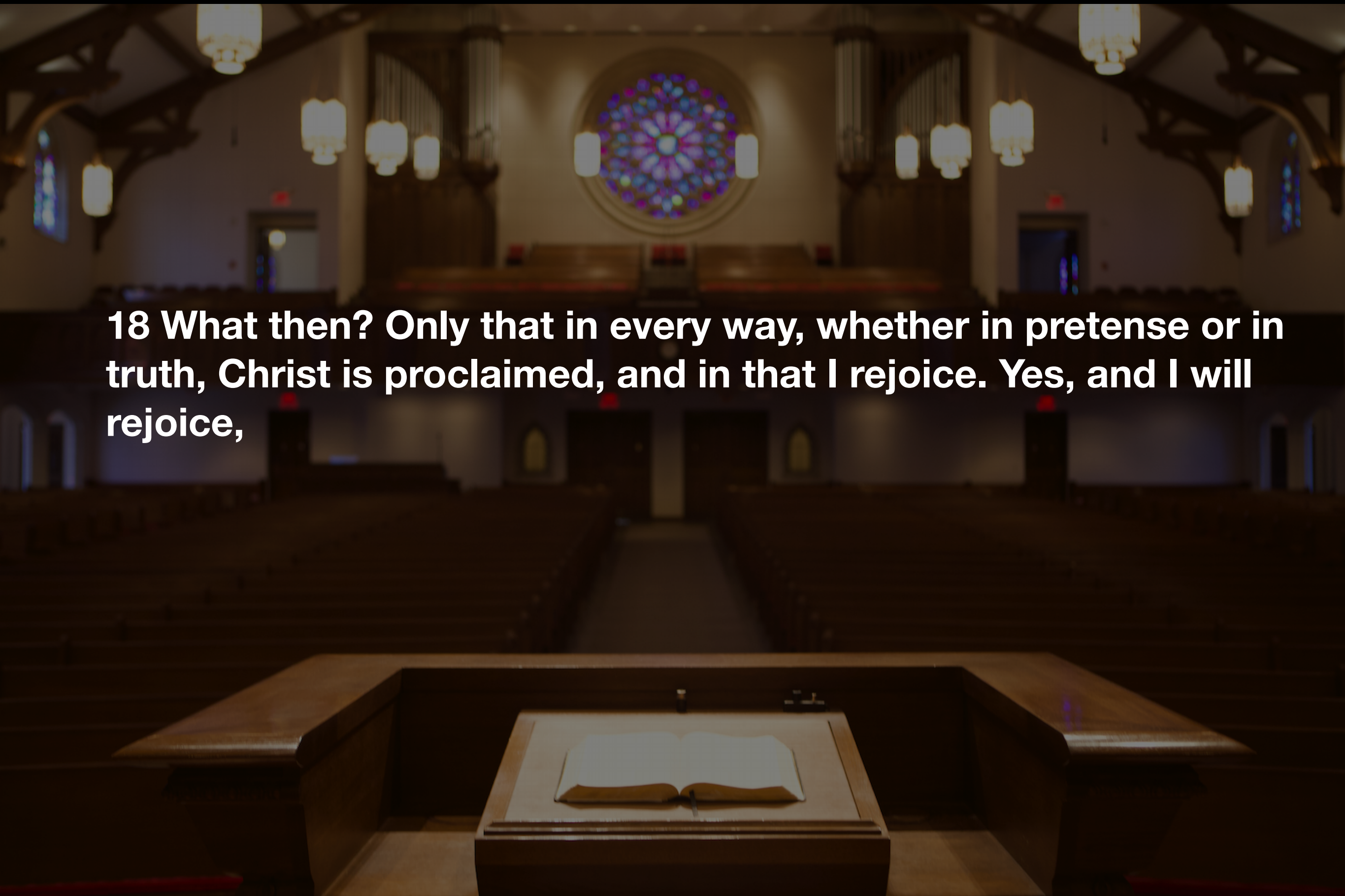

I am very happy to obey God's arrangement, because his arrangement is always loving and beautiful.


Obedience to another world
