Brief Survey of the Holy Spirit in the Old Testament

"The Old Testament may be likened to a chamber richly furnished but dimly lighted: the introduction of light brings into it nothing which was not in it before, but it brings out into clear view much of what is in it but was only dimly or not at all perceived before. The mystery of the Trinity is not revealed in the Old Testament but the mystery of the Trinity underlies the Old Testament revelation, and here and there almost comes into view. Thus, the Old Testament revelation of God is not corrected by the fuller revelation which follows it, but is only perfected, extended, and enlarged." B. B. Warfield

I. Key Roles of the Holy Spirit in the Old Testament

1. Creator Spiritus

- Genesis 1:2 The Spirit of God hovered over the waters at creation.
- Job 33:4 "The Spirit of God has made me."
- Psalm 104:30 "When you send your Spirit, they are created."

2. Empowering for Service/Implementer

- Exodus 31:2-5 Bezalel is filled with the Spirit for craftsmanship.
- Judges 3:10; 6:34; 14:6 The Spirit empowers judges to deliver Israel.
- 1 Samuel 16:13 The Spirit comes upon David at his anointing.

3. Prophetic Inspiration

- Numbers 11:25-29 The Spirit enables the seventy elders to prophesy.
- 2 Samuel 23:2 "The Spirit of the Lord spoke through me."
- Ezekiel 2:2; 3:24 The Spirit strengthens the prophet.
- Micah 3:8 Filled with power and justice by the Spirit.

4. Guidance and Instruction

- Nehemiah 9:20 "You gave your good Spirit to instruct them."
- Isaiah 63:11-14 The Spirit leads Israel through the wilderness.

5. Convicting and Restraining

Genesis 6:3 — "My Spirit will not strive with man forever."

II. The Spirit in Future Hope

- Isaiah 32:15 Spirit poured out leads to justice and peace.
- Isaiah 44:3 Promise to pour out Spirit on future generations.
- Ezekiel 36:26-27 New heart and Spirit indwelling.
- Ezekiel 37:14 "I will put my Spirit in you and you will live."
- Joel 2:28-29 "I will pour out my Spirit on all people."



Intertestamental Period

400 years of "silence"



"...in the fullness of time..."

- Augustus's leadership marked the start of the Pax Romana (Roman Peace), 200 years of stability.
 Through military control, political reform, and cultural renewal, he laid the foundation for imperial Rome's golden age.
- Stability leads to another invaluable by-product: the ease of good communication.
- One of the periods when a single language was widely understood, leading up to the first century, was marked by pervasive Greek thought forms and culture.
- Due to exilic life, Jews were everywhere, which supported monotheism, available translations of the OT for ordinary literates, innumerable synagogues, and Jewish worship services.

Jesus:

Conceived in Mary's womb

- Anointed at His baptism
- Continuously lived and worked
- Led into the desert
- Preached, healed, cast out
- Delivered up to death (Heb 9:14)
- Raised, revealed in power (Rom 1:4)
- Charged disciples between resurrection and ascension
- At ascension, subjected enemies
- Subordinated all angels and power to Himself (Eph 4:8; 1 Peter 3:22)
- Ascended on high, taking captive captives, giving gifts to men
- Exalted above all heavens
- Fulfilled all things (Eph 4:8-10)

Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit. 2 Cor 3:17-18

- The Hebrew word for Spirit is ruach (רוּח), meaning "breath," "wind," or "spirit."
- The Greek word is pneuma (πνεῦμα), meaning
 - 1. a current of air, i.e. breath (blast) or a breeze
 - 2. (by analogy or figuratively) a spirit
 - 3. (humanly) the rational soul
 - 4. (by implication) vital principle, mental disposition, etc.
 - 5. (superhumanly) an angel, or demon
 - 6. (divinely) God, Christ's spirit, the Holy Spirit

He is God. Acts 5:3-4; 1 Cor 3:16-17

He is distinguished from the Father and the Son. Matt 28:19; 2 Cor 13:13

He is not a force, but personal and communicative. Acts 13:2





New Identity and Assurance of Salvation

The Holy Spirit testifies with your spirit that you are a child of God (Romans 8:16).

- Assurance of salvation (John 17)
- Wisdom regarding suffering and hardship, supporting all the facets of your being: cognitive, emotional, physical, social, and spiritual. (Romans 8:17).

Inner Transformation and Sanctification

Spiritual fruit (Galatians 5:22–23) helping you to mortify the flesh (Romans 8:13).

- Progressive sanctification, glory to glory, of your inner woman and inner man.
- You become more like Christ through the Spirit's power and your own agency.
- Habits, desires, and affections are reshaped and mature throughout your days on earth.

Empowerment for Purpose and Witness
